

- When resetting a password, create one that is difficult to remember. This will encourage the person to login and change it to a password of his or her own choosing.

Password Rules:


- Minimum of 8 characters
- At least one upper-case letter
- At least one lower-case letter
- At least one number
- Cannot contain "pass"
- Never use the Delete button. For more information see the topic "Deactivate a User".
